### FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Exodus

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning prepared the Passover. And as they were eating he took some bread, he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standingstones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' # **SECOND READING**

### A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God. He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him, says the Lord.


# **MEDITATION**

When we receive from the Lord's table we unite ourselves to Jesus Christ, who makes us sharers in his body and blood. Ignatius of Antioch (35-107 A.D.) calls it the "one bread that provides the medicine of immortality, the antidote for death, and the food that makes us live for ever in Jesus Christ" (Ad Eph. 20,2). This supernatural food is healing for both body and soul and strength for our journey heavenward. When you approach the Table of the Lord, what do you expect to receive? Healing, pardon, comfort, and rest for your soul? The Lord has much more for us, more than we can ask or imagine. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist is an intimate union with Christ. As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens us in charity and enables us to break with disordered attachments to creatures and to be more firmly rooted in the love of Christ. Do you hunger for the "bread of life"? Lord Jesus, vou nourish and sustain us with vour verv own presence and life. You are the "Bread of Life" and the "Cup of Salvation". May I always hunger for you and be satisfied Hebrews 9:11-15 in you alone.

### **EUCHARIST** with Dr. Brant Pitre Wednesday after 7pm in the Pastoral Centre


